- B. Sodom and Gomorrah revisited (1:9-17)
- C. Clean as snow, white as wool! But you must decide (1:18-20)
- D. Once the Faithful City, but now the Filthy City (1:21-31)

TWO

- A. All will learn the ways of worship, none the ways of war (2:1-5)
- B. When men shall crawl and cringe in caves (2:6-22)

THREE

- A. The politicians will panic and be the first to be prosecuted (3:1-14)
- B. Followed by those worldly and wicked women (3:15-26)

FOUR

- A. Marriage proposals from seven women (4:1)
- B. A cloud canopy by day and one of fire by night (4:2-6)

FIVE

- A. A sad song about a fruitless vineyard (5:1-10)
- B. Wickedness from morning till night, causing hell to enlarge itself (5:11-17)
- C. A case of spiritual insanity where right is wrong, wrong is right, black is white, and bitter is sweet (5:18-23)
- D. He'll notify the nations: "They're yours for the taking!" (5:24-30)

SIX

- A. They sang, "Holy, holy, holy," while he sobbed, "filthy, filthy, filthy!" (6:1-7)
- B. He heard the voice and he volunteered (6:8-13)
